

Dancing through the Diagnosis!



TIKTOKING THROUGH TREATMENT

A TECHNOLOGIST'S JOURNEY THROUGH CANCER

It is the words no one wants to hear, "Unfortunately, it is breast cancer". At that moment, a thousand things went through my mind, the top three of which were confusion, shock, and absolute terror. Watching my husband crumble before my eyes, my sons' sorrowful cries of not knowing what was happening and why their mom and dad were so sad. The gut-wrenching sobs and dread that followed that day will always stick with me. In the days following, I realized I had a choice to make. I could let this unfortunate diagnosis bring my family down, or I could move forward reaching down inside myself and fight. Of course, I chose to fight.

Being a radiologic technologist and educator for almost 16 years now, I had some comfort in knowing that I would be familiar with some of the exams and procedures I would be having done. As the one that normally provides the medical care, having to now be the patient was frightening. Surprisingly, having the support of my radiology family was something that brought me comfort. It was amazing to see technologists in our field be part of my treatment. With all the unknowns surrounding my journey, seeing a friendly face while having my mammograms, ultrasounds, MRIs, guided biopsies, and radiation treatments was something that gave me strength through this process. Even without actually knowing the technologists, I felt we immediately had a connection working in the same field.

I realized that the positivity and care they showed really affected the way I approached my treatment. Knowing that they were in the position to be the light in a dark situation really brings everything full circle. Throughout my diagnosis and treatment, I was able to make many new friends in our profession. Through these interactions, I was able to experience first-hand how important our roles are as part of the health care team. I want to make sure I continue to show my own patients that they matter and will be well taken care of.

There were many things that gave me strength, primarily being my support system and tons of prayer. My family and friends became the rock I needed to persevere. I was humbled at the amount of people that voiced their support, love, and prayers for my journey. As we go through life, we sometimes forget that we are not traveling our paths alone. There are people that are with us to offer support, encouragement, prayer, and rejoice in our accomplishments.

I soon realized that staying positive was essential during this time in my life. I began to look at the positives in everything about my situation and realized that I am lucky and thankful for the life I have. I realized I could not change my diagnosis, and it could have been much worse. I began to find things that made myself and others smile including doing silly TikTok dances after my chemo and radiation treatments with my husband and wearing what I called my cancer-fighting light-up shoes to every appointment. The shoes caught people's attention and put smiles on their faces. The dancing gave me something to look forward to on days that I would otherwise be feeling down. Soon I became known as the TikTok girl. Causing people to look forward to my weekly dances put joy in my heart knowing people were rooting for me.

This diagnosis not only affected my personal life, it also had an impact on my professional one as well. I began to notice that my positivity was spreading to others around me and giving others strength in their situations. As an Assistant Professor and Clinical Educator in Radiologic Technology, I decided to continue working through all my treatments, trusting my body to let me know if I was pushing too hard. When technologists would see me, they would be so surprised that I was there pushing through and still doing what I love. I feel it helped them to see me and know that if I could stay strong, then with any situation in their lives they can stay strong and get through as well. God had given me a platform to share my journey and help others show them that there is strength deep inside everyone.

I have now healed from surgery, successfully completed my 12 rounds of chemotherapy, as well as my four weeks of

radiation therapy. I am happy to say I am feeling great! I am slowly getting my energy back and of course continuing to work in our profession. I still have more hurdles to go and, of course, continuous follow-ups, but with staying positive and knowing my strength, I know that I can do all things through Christ who strengthens me.


