House of Delegates Reno

AFFILIATE DELEGATE REPORT

he 2025 American Society of Radiologic Technologists (ASRT) Annual Governance and House of Delegates Meeting was held in Reno, Nevada, from June 19–22, 2025. This event brought together medical imaging and therapy professionals from across the country to engage in governance, policy-making, and professional development. The meeting also included the ASRT Educational Symposium, offering a variety of continuing education opportunities.

Heather C. Koepp and Monica Weber proudly served as affiliate delegates, actively participating in governance discussions and voting on behalf of Louisiana.

Key governance activities included:

By Laws:

25.01 – Membership, Section 1. Policy and Procedure, A.

Revised to reinforce ASRT's commitment to equal opportunity and nondiscrimination.

Legal counsel addressed the HOD, emphasizing the importance of aligning with federal mandates.

25.03 – Membership, Section 3. Dues and Fees

Proposed allowing the ASRT Board to increase dues by up to 8% without HOD approval. Justified by the fact that dues have remained unchanged since 2013, despite rising operational costs.

2024-2025 LSRT President, Heather C. Koepp nominated Carmen George for the position of Vice Speaker of the House of Delegates. Carmen has been a longtime LSRT member, served twice as the LSRT Chair of the Board of Directors, and held every LSRT officer position. Carmen was elected by acclamation, marking a proud moment for Louisiana representation at the national level.

Three outstanding students from Louisiana were selected to participate in the ASRT Student to Leadership Development Program (SLDP), Chris Brister (LSUA), Kam Michel (North Oaks), and Heaven Phillips

(North Oaks). Their selection reflects the strength of Louisiana's programs and the commitment of its students to professional growth and leadership.

Allison Puente served as the SLDP mentor, guiding and supporting the student participants throughout the program.

Attending the 2025 ASRT Annual Governance and House of Delegates Meeting was an enriching experience. It reinforced the importance of advocacy, education, and unity within our profession. The event provided valuable opportunities to connect with peers, share best practices, and collaborate on initiatives that will shape the future of our profession. We are honored to have represented our affiliate and look forward to applying the insights gained to support our local initiatives.
